ADVENT DISPLAY:

Why so many candles and a blue candle? When discussions about the advent services took place in October, Pastor Waldo told us about an advent display that other churches he attended have used for the advent season. Upon researching this style of advent wreath, it was learned that the Advent wreath was "invented" by Johann Hinrich Wichern, who was a German pastor, and founded an orphanage in Hamburg in 1833. During the weeks leading up to Christmas, the children would ask him daily when Christmas would arrive. To make the waiting easier, Wichern came up with his own Christmas countdown, creating his first Advent wreath out of an old cartwheel and small candles. The blue Christ candle is because our counting down candles are white. Traditionally the Advent wreath, four candles on a wreath of evergreen, shaped in a perfect circle to symbolize the eternity of God. In some churches, four purple candles, one for each week in Advent, are used with one larger white candle in the middle as the Christ candle. Other churches prefer three purple or blue candles with one candle being rose or pink, to represent joy. We also this year have a blue series of bulletins for the Advent to Epiphany season. The blue candle is to continue that theme, and to give the Christ candle a distinct place on the advent display.
