The Search Committee is pleased to announce Daniel Janzen as candidate for Lead Pastor. Daniel was baptized at NUMC and was a member until 2013 when he was called to pastor the Carrot River Mennonite Church Saskatchewan. He and his wife Ana have two high energy boys, Elijah age 3 and one year old Leopold.

Daniel attended Brock University where he earned his BA in Business and Economics, followed by a Masters of Divinity at Tyndale University College and a Masters in Theological Studies from Wycliffe College in Toronto. He accepted a two year assignment with Mennonite Central Committee in Sarajevo, Bosnia. It was here that Daniel met his wife Ana, who was there from Serbia to assist her Aunt Snezana in leading an MCC workshop. And it was here, while praying about his future, that he felt God calling him to serve as a pastor in the Mennonite church.

In his ministerial role, Daniel has gained depth and uncommon experience with the officiating of two tragic and high profile funeral services. In 2015, three teenage athletes died in a car crash and over 2000 people were in attendance at the service. And in 2018, the service for the Humboldt Broncos bus driver saw over 500 in attendance. One of Daniel's references says "I am personally challenged by Daniel's presence to the aging, dying and grieving...".

Daniel has involved himself in the local community by participating in events and sitting on two local boards, helping him understand the values and hopes of the community better. Daniel says that out of the joy of relationships, comes better worship. He likes to envision, working with people to learn what they want and then help them get there.

Daniel is passionate about continued education and learning, recently attending Canadian Mennonite University's ReNew: Resourcing Pastors for Ministry, a conference focused on preaching and teaching from a story perspective; he attended an MC Saskatchewan workshop on Biblical engagement-Anabaptist theology; and this past year, he and Ana co-led a workshop at MC Sask's Equipping Day, "Will our children have faith?" Practicing our faith with our children". He endeavours to read through the Bible every year to become more familiar with the text. He has completed a preaching course at Nipawin Bible College in Regina.

Preaching is a big part of Daniel's ministerial life along with regular church activities such as worship leading a service every two months, council meetings, leading monthly services and memorial services at the local care home, devotionals at teas, Maundy Thursday service, visiting people, funerals, weddings, child dedications, baptisms, pre-marriage counseling, catechism, leading Bible studies, and even helping to put together the annual report booklet and getting men to join the choir.

Daniel has a variety of personal interests which includes baking bread, making jam, failing at gardening, reading and "Cowboying" – feeding cows in the winter time, and experiencing Canadian winters at -42C and six months of metres of wonderfully white, clean, dry snow. This past year he and Ana created a story book about an MCC after-school program in Bolivia, which was featured at the MCC's Sask Relief Sale.

It is said of Daniel that he "is gifted as a pastor. He demonstrates strong pastoral skills and sensibilities. He seems blessed, given, and sent by God to shepherd congregations (see Ephesians 4:11-13)."
