"What Does it Look Like When God moves into your Neighbourhood?"

John, known as the "beloved disciple" because of his close relationship with Jesus, wrote the last of the four gospel accounts of Jesus life. While each of the synoptic gospels (Matthew, Mark, and Luke) add their own unique perspective on Jesus, John stands out from the other three. By the time John writes several decades have passed since Jesus returned

to heaven, and legends and distortions about Jesus had become common (sort of like the legends that develop around famous current figures like John F. Kennedy or Elvis Presley). John, writing many years after the others, gives much more explanation and interpretation of Jesus' life. Much of John is a record of the teachings of Jesus.

John was in a privileged position to write his gospel. He was a witness to everything that he recorded; "This is the disciple who testifies to these things and who wrote them down. We know that his testimony is true" (John 21:24). Guided by the Holy Spirit, he gave generations of people the opportunity to understand the "big picture" of God's purpose in sending Jesus into this world. As John puts it, his purpose in writing was "that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you have life in his name".

Leading up to Easter, we will explore the first part of this gospel in our Sunday morning messages.

I invite each one of you to read the Bible passage in the week before each message (the passages will be listed in the bulletin). Pray over the passage as you read it and ask the Spirit to show you what God wants you to see. I will do the best I can, in God's power, to preach the passage, but the greatest work happens when you open your heart to the Spirit of God and receive what God shows you.
