<u>Sponsorship</u> & <u>Settlement Committee update</u>: Many of you are wondering what is happening with our refugee sponsorship, when other local churches are hosting newcomer families already. What we have learned is this: the family we were expecting last January has six children, not just three. Two daughters are married and living in Lebanon, while the eldest son is still in Syria. When it was their turn to board a flight for Canada, they decided, for the sake of their son, to say, "Not yet."

Hearing about the warm welcome they could expect from our congregation didn't make the decision any easier, although it encouraged them to look forward to coming here. Weeks passed, and the government program that would have brought them to Toronto free of charge came to an end.

Because of their difficult situation, this family remains approved for future resettlement in Canada. In addition, they will now be government-assisted rather than privately-sponsored. They will receive 12 rather than 6 months of income support from the Canadian government, and we will not be notified of their arrival. Our only link to them now is through their nephews.

Neither MCC nor our committee has been informed of the reason for, or purpose of, this switch in status. Mohamad and Mukhtar are left in limbo, too. They expected their relatives to join them; instead, they are on their own. The brief notification we received indicated that the family will be sent to Hamilton for their initial orientation.

Sponsorship & Settlement remains committed to this family for the time being, irrespective of their immigration status. We have also been considering other options for participation in the important task of resettling newcomers already here as well as those still abroad. MCC continues to send us updates on government and citizen-led initiatives and is ready to assist us, as a congregation, in any way.

Meanwhile, the two young newcomers in our midst still require our prayerful support as they struggle with a new language, culture, climate, and expectations around education and employment. Please contact Jocelyn Thwaites if you would like to get to know them better.



<u>Sermon Series Part II on the Gospel of John:</u>



"What Does it Look Like When Jesus is Really at the Core of Your Life?"

From January to Easter we explored the gospel of John as it traced Jesus' life through his ministry to the cross and resurrection. As John describes it in the opening verses, Jesus is the very presence of his Heavenly Father moving into our neighbourhood — the Incarnation of God.

From Easter to the end of June we will explore the teachings of Jesus in the gospel of John, where Jesus shows us what it looks like when WE welcome God to incarnate the presence of Christ in US. We do this not on our own, but by the work of Jesus in us by his Spirit.

Through images and careful instructions, Jesus shares with his disciples his dreams for what it looks like when we live with Jesus at the core of our lives.

You will get the most out of these messages if you read the chapter of John in the days leading up to that Sunday. May God bring Jesus' vision for us to a reality among us in this congregation.
