Sponsorship & Settlement Committee report: After our congregation voted to privately sponsor a Syrian refugee family last fall, we were matched with a family of five (plus two brothers) and spent the winter preparing for their arrival. Then, for whatever reason, their file was transferred to the government-assisted refugee program, meaning that we had no contractual responsibility for them anymore. MCC offered to help us apply for another family, but at that time, Canada was already closing its doors and it was unlikely that another match would be available. Members of the Sponsorship & Settlement Committee decided to honour our prior commitment, which would now be more social than financial.

When the newcomers arrived in April, one of their first requests was for assistance in sponsoring their 19-year-old daughter and her husband, who had been left behind. While there was concern about overextending our volunteer capacity, one of our committee members began to do the paperwork. A small window of opportunity had opened up through the Syrian family reunification program. We would need to act quickly to take advantage of it.

Church Council last week agreed that submitting an application for the young couple in question fulfills the mandate given to us by the congregation last fall. We also have sufficient funds in our sponsorship account. For social support we are counting on the newcomer family and their friends. As before, our application to sponsor is going through MCC, although a final decision will be made by Canadian immigration officials. We have no idea about a time line in this case, but look forward to updates from the family and from MCC. Thank you to everyone for your interest and your prayers. --- Greta Wiens
