"Called to be Servants of Christ in Our Community" expresses our desire to share our faith and love of Jesus Christ with all we meet. Litany of Release and Blessing

Leader 1: We have laughed together, cried together, Worshipped together, prayed together. We have shared our very hearts and lives together.

Leader 2: We have hoped together, dreamed together, Worked together, and eaten lots of potlucks together.

People: Now it is time to say goodbye.

Leader 1: Parting is bittersweet. Memories flood our minds and hearts.

People: We say goodbye with gratitude and sadness mixed together in all sorts of strange ways.

Leader 2: In saying goodbye to Rudy, we release him from his responsibilities as Lead Pastor of Niagara United Mennonite Church. Will you join me in this release?

People: With God's help, we release Rudy from his responsibilities as our Lead Pastor.

Rudy: As a symbol of this release, I give to you, Rick, as chair of church council, a picture of a sailboat representing an anchor, a map, and a sail. I pray that Niagara United Mennonite church will keep on being anchored in Jesus, immersing itself in the map of God's Word, and raising its sails to be filled with the Wind of the Spirit of God, so that God's Spirit can lead you to new places in God's Kingdom as a congregation.

People: With God's help, we will keep on being anchored in Christ, immersing ourselves in God's Word, and raising our sails to be filled with the Wind of the Spirit.

Leader 1: In saying goodbye to Sharon, we release her from her responsibilities as Minister of Pastoral Care of Niagara United Mennonite Church. Will you join me in this release?

People: With God's help, we release Sharon from her responsibilities as our Minister of Pastoral Care.

Sharon: And I give you, Rita, as Chair of the Visitation Committee, this plant as a symbol of the congregation as a living organism which needs to be cared for, nurtured, and watered. I pray that this congregation will keep on caring for one another, in familiar ways and in ways yet to be imagined.

People: With God's help, we will keep on caring for one another.

All: With God's help, we release you, Rudy and Sharon, as our pastors. As we release you from the ministry at Niagara United Mennonite Church, we also want to ask God's blessing on your future work in the Kingdom of God.

We offer our support and encouragement to you as your ministry unfolds in new settings. We pray God's blessings on you and on us as we begin a new relationship with each other, in which you are no longer our pastor.

Leader 2: Now I ask you, Rudy and Sharon, do you release this congregation from its loyalty to you as pastors? Do you release its members from turning to you and depending on you to provide the pastoral ministries they seek?

Sharon and Rudy: With the help of God, we release this congregation from its loyalty and dependence on us as its pastors. We pray God's blessing on each person here in his or her spiritual journey, and we pray God's blessing on Niagara United Mennonite Church in its continued ministry.

All: In our many interactions as a community of followers of Jesus, we have spoken many words, and shared many activities. Inevitably there have been times when we have not always understood each other fully, and where we may even have offended each other. Where this has been the case we humbly ask forgiveness from each other. And we also offer forgiveness to each other. Let there be nothing between us except for the debt of love and the mercy and presence of Christ.

In the course of our interactions we have also experienced the wonderful diversity of each other's personality and gifts. We give thanks to God for enriching each one of us in the community of Christ, far beyond what we could become on our own. God has indeed been among us.

Leader 1: Let us join in prayer.

Eternal God, you have been our refuge and strength through the years of our life together. Give to us a strong sense of your presence as we now go our separate ways. Enlarge our faith, that we may see your purpose unfolding in the happenings of this time. Be our guide through all that is dark and doubtful. Grant us peace in doing your will. Bless and help us as we move into your future. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.
