**Bulletin Change** – In a unanimous decision, the Spiritual Council has voted to remove the attendance figures from the bulletin. The insertion of the attendance figures does not align with what we believe to be our spiritual values. However, it was felt to be correct to let the community know the reasoning behind discontinuing the practice. In 2 Samuel 2, King David is reprimanded by God for counting his fighting men, as it indicated putting trust in his army rather than God. In the same way, we felt we were putting our hopes in numbers of attendees rather than in the relationships with Christ that we are building. We recognize that in this age of statistics, this number has meaning. Yet, it is also a number that the powers of this world can use to drown out the voice of God. So, we have decided to discontinue the practice of announcing attendance figures. We encourage you to talk with members of Spiritual Council if you are hearing a different word, that we may discern together what God is saying in this matter.
