This is a wonderful opportunity to invite your friends and family to come with you to church as we celebrate these most special days in the church calendar! Fire Doors -This past week we had our annual fire inspection done. This is mandatory and ensures the integrity of our fire systems and in the event of a fire. We have been reminded again that the use of any type of wedge or door stop to prop open the fires door is not allowed, ever. The fire doors are equipped with automatic doors closures that are supposed hold themselves in an open position when there is no alarm. There are many that are not working at this time. We need to replace the power system that operates the doors. For now, the only doors that may be held open by their own hinge are clearly marked with signage. They include the two doors at the back of the sanctuary, the doors on the 2nd floor of the education wing by Pastor David Lewis's office, the right side door by the church office, the right side door by the kitchen. We have removed the wedges from the building we ask that new ones not be made. Failure to follow the fire code by tampering with systems not only leaves the church vulnerable in the event of a fire, it puts us in a position of violating our property insurance. Should there be a fire and doors were not used properly or on a random inspection found to be open, voids our property insurance and sets us up to receive a financial fine. We thank everyone for your adherence to the church's fire policy as mandated by the Ontario Fire Code.
