The Search Committee is pleased to introduce Chris Hutton. Consensus was unanimous that we call Chris to candidate for the position of Pastor of Youth and Young Adult Ministries. Following is a brief bio telling you a bit of his story.

When he was 17 years old, Chris was invited by a good friend to come along to a youth meeting. He went. The friend invited him again and again. Chris "was impacted by that example" and his passion for youth and the Lord

was born. He was baptized in 2007 and ordained in 2015 (MCEC). He and his wife Michele have two lovely children, Elora age 14 and Xander age 9.

Chris has a Masters degree in Language and Literature from the University of Waterloo and is currently working on part-time studies towards a Masters in Theological Studies at Conrad Grebel. He regularly attends the School for Ministers provided by MCEC each year. He participated in the Transition to Ministry program which helped him acclimatize to the MCEC family from coming out of the Brethren In Christ family.

After graduation, Chris became the Chaplain of The Navigators of Canada, a Christian campus group, at the University of Waterloo. The mission statement of the campus ministry is "Intentionally and actively engaging in relational ministry with students." He served in this role, ministering to students, for four years.

Following his years as Chaplain, he became Lead Pastor at The Meeting House church plants in Oakville and then Ottawa. After five years in Ottawa, Chris and his wife wanted to be closer to family. He says they felt "it was time to come back so our kids could know their grandparents." They moved to St. Catharines and he served as Lead Pastor at First Mennonite Church in Vineland, recently completing a three year term.

Chris began a process of discernment over where God was calling him to next. About a year prior, his wife had suggested to him that he be part of an upcoming youth camp. Here he discovered that his passion for youth was alive and well. Chris says "the church grows and continues when people hear about Jesus and choose to follow him, including our kids."

In addition to experience with the aspects of pastoring, Chris has developed particular skills with youth, through his 21 years of volunteering as the leader and coordinator of the Family Camp Teen Program with Camp Hermosa, a Christian camp in Goderich.

Over the course of his 16 years of full-time ministry he has been involved in everything from working in university contexts, to creative city-based evangelism, to the integration and care of multiple ages and stages together in community.

Chris tells us his hobbies include reading, watching movies and sports, hiking outdoors, hanging out at Lakeside Park in St. Catharines, and walking down Queen Street in Niagara-on-The-Lake. He has volunteered for such things as the peach canning program, a kitchen service for drop-in meals and a food hamper program. He has strong interests in poverty and peacemaking.

Asked about a highlight of his career, he says "a highlight of my ministry career would be when our church in Ottawa partnered with Ottawa InnerCity Ministries to put on a comedy show that raised money for their organization and also collected much-needed socks for the winter season. We called it Laugh Your Socks Off."

One of Chris's references writes "Chris is a committed follower of Jesus and to the Mennonite church. He is passionate about deepening the spiritual experience of people in the church and helping them to be faithful followers of Jesus."
