MEDITATING ON THE CROSS:

The cross on the wall of our sanctuary is plain and smooth. The one that stands in our worship space for Lent is rough and adorned with both thorns and flowers, symbols of our sins and God's healing grace. Read the accounts of Jesus' death and resurrection from one of the Gospels. Meditate on a cross, visualizing Jesus suffering and dying there for you. Then take in the truth that He is no longer there — It is finished! He is risen indeed!
