Our Advent theme for this year has been Restoration is Near. We have been called to Watch for, to Prepare for, to Tell and to Trust that God restoration is at hand. Today on Christmas Day, we are called to Rejoice because God's restoration has begun with birth of a child.

We are surprised once again at the way the story has unfolded, by the way that God's presence returns to his people in the form of human baby born to obscure parents in the hinterlands of Galilee – far from Temple, the place where God's presence used to dwell, far from Jerusalem, the city that God had formerly chosen for himself, and far from the Davidic ruling family of old.

In Matthew 1, our scripture on 4th Advent, an angel of the Lord appears to Joseph in a dream to tell him that the child of Mary, his wife, is to be God's servant. This is beginning of God's restoration plan for all the world – that God is with us!

One of our Christmas Day scripture readings comes from John 1:1-14, in which we read, "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.... And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth."

This passage reminds us that Jesus has been central to God's work and plans from the beginning, to reveal God the Father to us and his everlasting love and presence in a new and glorious way – God with us, God one of us, God in human form –Jesus.

Restoration is Here because Jesus has arrived –and we rejoice!

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. May the Spirit fill your hearts and homes this Christmas Day and in 2023.
