About the worship visuals:

The items placed at the front depict various key faith values of the Anabaptist movement. The Bible reflects the centrality of the Scriptures, and is open to Jeremiah 6:16 — “Stand at the crossroads and look; ask for the ancient paths, where the good way is, and walk in it.” The symbol on the glass art is of the logo of the former General Conference Mennonite Church, which became part of MC Canada; the line below the globe and the cross represents 1st Corinthians 3:11 — “For no one can lay any foundation other than the one already laid, which is Jesus Christ.”. Menno Simons frequently headed his writings with this verse. The bread and cup remind us of the Anabaptist reinterpretation of communion as an act of remembrance, instead of a literal transformation into the body and blood of Christ, and recall the severe risks the early Anabaptists took to celebrate communion separate from the state church and its leaders. The lantern represents the Anabaptist story of moving from place to place because of persecution, yet keeping the light of faith shining bright. The value of peace and non-violence is reflected by the white feather; during wartimes, the white feather has been used as a sign of choosing against military involvement, but also for shaming those who refused to don the military uniform. The basin and towel remind us of calling everyone in the faith community to be both priests and servants to one another.
